### PROGRAM INFORMATION

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Major in Climate Law (60cp). To be eligible for the Climate Law Major, students must complete six elective subjects from the Climate Major options across their Law Electives.

### SUBJECT INFORMATION

New students from semester 233 (September 2023) will enrol in the new CORE subject codes - CORE11-011 (CORE11-001) - CORE11-012 (CORE11-003) - CORE11-013 - Students may choose to complete an optional Law Major (60cp) in Climate Law. Please refer to Law Major information for subject options.

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Specialisation (40cp) in one of the following areas:

- Canadian Law and Practice Climate Law Contemporary Legal Issues Corporate and Commercial Law International and Comparative Law
- Legal Innovation and Technology
   Legal Practice

To be eligible for a Law Specialisation, students must complete a minimum of four Law Electives (40 credit points) within one of the above areas. Eligible students will receive a Specialisation Certificate at the completion of their Law program.

Bachelor of Laws with Honours - Please see eligibility requirements for achieving Honours (\*\*including the completion of LAWS13-569 Legal Research Project as an elective) on the Law Honours / Distinction information webpage.

#### ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE

Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.

Students may have the opportunity to participate in an international study tour experience or internship as a general elective.
