### **PROGRAM INFORMATION**

#### Bachelor of Law Major

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Major in Climate Law (60cp) or Legal Innovation and Technology (60cp). To be eligible for a Major, students must complete six elective subjects (60cp) from either the Climate Major subject options or the Legal Innovation and Technology subject options. #### Bachelor of Law Specialisation

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Specialisation (40CP). Students must complete a minimum of four Law Electives within one of the specialisation areas (see below). Eligible students will receive a Specialisation Certificate. Please see details of the Specialisation options on the Bachelor of Laws/Subjects webpage.

- Climate Law

Bachelor of Laws degrees are awarded with Honours according to the student's cumulative percentage average of Law subjects and the grade awarded for successful completion of LAWS13-569 Legal Research Project (as an elective) for students commencing a Bachelor of Laws program in or after 2015. For students who commenced their Bachelor of Law program prior to 2015 and for further information on the Bachelor of Law (Hons), please see the Law Honours / Distinction information webpage.

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Major in Legal Transformation (60cp). To be eligible for a Legal Transformation Major, students must complete six subjects from the Legal Transformation Major options across their Law Electives.

### SUBJECT INFORMATION

#### ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE

Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.

Students may have the opportunity to participate in an international study tour experience or internship as a general elective.
